Daniel's law prohibits disclosure of the residential addresses of certain persons covered by the law ("Covered Persons") on websites controlled by state, county, and local government agencies. The community of Covered Persons includes former, active, and retired judicial officers, prosecutors, and members of law enforcement and their immediate family members residing in the same household.

With respect to Internet postings other than those on New Jersey state, county, and municipal government websites, an authorized person, as defined by law, seeking to prohibit the disclosure of the home address or unpublished home telephone number of any covered person shall provide written notice to the entity or person advising that they are an authorized person and that they are requesting that the entity or person cease the disclosure of the information and remove the protected information from the Internet or where it is otherwise made available. See, N.J.S.A. 2C:20-31.1(c) and N.J.S.A. 56:8-166.1(a)(2).

While Daniels Law addresses the prohibiting of disclosure, the existing electronic records that reside on an agency's website need to be retained accordingly.

The Office of Information Privacy, established to carry out the mandate of Daniel's Law, has been enrolling Covered Persons since July of 2022. Redactors, who are responsible for removing Covered Persons' residence information from public-facing state, county, and municipal government websites, have been carrying out this role since January 2023. Representatives of the OIP will present a brief history of Daniel's Law, an overview of the operation of portals that are used by covered persons and redactors, provide information on pending bills that may broaden the impact of Daniel's Law, and engage in Q and A with those who are in attendance.
