When the parties submit to arbitration, they agree to be bound by and comply with the arbitrators' written decision.

 - c) Under current law, any time after a collective negotiation agreement between a public employer and a public police or fire department expires, either party may petition the NJ Public Employment Relations Commission (PERC) for arbitration
